Regular Meeting  
Monday, December 14, 2009

1. Call to Order

Mrs. Karakla called the meeting to order at 4:33 pm

Mr. Burns motioned to approve minutes as read. Mr. Peine second all were in favor.

Administrative Reports

Mr. Barger informed the council the first semester field day was a great success. The ping-pong trophy stays in the name of Mr. Barger. Mr. Adams made a good run for it. The adults beat the students in tug-a-war. No one was hurt. One student did go awol. We will have another field day in April 2010.

Mr. Barger informed the council finals will begin tomorrow December 15<sup>th</sup>. The finals will count as 10 to 15% of final grade. Tuesday will be classes 1 & 2. Wednesday will be 3 & 4 and Thursday will be classes 5 & 6. All three days will be half day for students with release time at 12:00 pm.

Mr. Barger informed the council that one Vail High School teacher will be resigning at the end of the semester. Mrs. Rempfer the Business Teacher will be getting married. Interviews have gone well and there will be a teacher hired by the time we come back in January.

Pampered Chef Fundraiser is over and went well. Vail High School will receive 10% from the consulted and 15% from Pampered Chef. Over all VHS will receive close to \$500.00. Funds earned from the fundraiser goes towards things such as field day, snacks for testing etc.

F. Recognitions

Mr. Barger recognized Mr. Frausel the Student Council sponsor and the Winter Formal that was held Friday, December 11<sup>th</sup> went well. Several staff members were there to help chaperone and all went well considering about 40 or 50 students are on academic probation and were not permitted to attend. Mr. Barger also recognized Mrs. Peters one of our part time teachers for

taking the time to organize advisor base activities such as Navigation 101 for students. Navigation 101 is a computer program that helps students with college and career choices.

## 2. Old Business

### A. Enrollment Summary

The number as of today is 159. Mr. Barger shared with the council that the number will change in January. There will be several students leaving for different reasons. One will be moving out of state, several have been on the waiting list for Empire and now there are openings so they will be going to Empire, several will be going to Vail Distance Learning Program. We will also be receiving several new students.

### B. Construction Update

Mr. Barger informed the council that the construction for the new school has begun and there are trenches dug and ready to go. Mr. Barger also shared that masonry walls should be up by the time we come back in January. The construction crew will be working 6 days a week to get the job done in time for the new school year.

### C. Grade Level Caps

Mr. Barger explained to the council that one of the things approved by the council in the charter page 2 is the school is designed for 225 students. Mr. Barger shared that we need to be flexible with the number per grade level. It is not always going to work out that the grade levels will be exact. Mr. Barger told the council the Tuesday after break there will be planning committee meeting of parents and staff members to talk about classroom size, specials, afterschool programs, hire an afterschool program parents will have to pay for. How to structure middle school, class to class move around. Mr. Barger shared with the council he has had several calls from teachers in the district and out of the district interested in what we are doing and looking for a job. Mr. Barger also shared the concern of enrolling students to make sure that all siblings are able to get in. Mrs. Karakla showed interest hiring UofA graduate students in teaching at the new school. Mr. Burns asked about the 25per classroom and how this would work. Mr. Burns feels it should be an administrative decision on number of students per classroom. Mr. Barger shared that it may not work that each grade level have the 25 students per class, since some parents may have more than one or two children.

### D. VAHS Logo

Mr. Barger shared the logo that took the lead with staff and students. Mr. Barger showed several logos. Mr. Barger would like to have the logo done and approved soon so that when the Billboard final decision on the logo. The council and staff and students like the shield shape for a logo. Mr. Barger gave the council a copy of the shield for the council to sketch their own versions.

### E. Number of Classes for Seniors

Mr. Barger shared with the council that at the last principal meeting it was discussed what kind of policy was in the district that high school seniors take 4 classes and that 20% of seniors take 4 out of the 6 classes. At Cienega 1/3 take 4, 1/3 take 5 and some take 7 counting the zero hour class that some seniors take. The reason for some seniors taking only 4 is due to work or some take a college class. Research has shown students do better when taking a full day of classes. Bottom line do we allow the 4 or have the seniors take 6 classes per day. Vail High School does not offer PE so what other class can they take. Seniors can be a 1A. Pima classes do not count in funding for the school. Students are required to take CTE classes and Fine Art classes to meet graduation requirements. It is a general consensus that seniors take six classes.

#### 4. New Business

##### A. Traffic Policies - Expectations

Mr. Barger shared with the council a map of Vail Academy and High School and the impact of driving to the school. Mrs. Karakla asked about parents driving their students to school and the students driving to school and parking. Mr. Barger showed the council where the parking will be for students and the drop off for parents and the bus drop off. Mr. Barger shared with the council that high school students should never drive by where the parent drop off area is.

Mr. Barger shared with the council that as of now there will be no transportation for the elementary students. He also talked about if the bus is not full will a sibling be able to ride the bus. Mrs. Karakla asked if the high school students will have to pay for a parking permit and fills they should pay. Mr. Barger shared that some schools charge \$100.00 for a parking permit. We will not charge \$100.00 but at least \$20.00 for a parking permit. The parking lot will be big enough for 89 staff and student parking; there will be no parking on the street. Mrs. Karakla asked if there would be parking for motorcycles. Mr. Barger said he would look into that. Mr. Barger did say that he believes that some high school students will be driving their siblings to school. Mrs. Karakla asked if there will be speed humps in the parking lot to slow drivers down. Mr. Barger responded they are waiting to see where they should go.

##### B. Enrollment Update

Mr. Barger shared with the council we began December 1 we sent 23 packs out and none have been returned but 15 have been down loaded and turned in. Mr. Barger told the staff that there will be an article in the South East Connection on Vail Academy and High School that goes to all Vail and Rita Ranch families, also the front page of the Vail Vista that goes to all families in Vail and Rita Ranch area. The Arizona Daily Star will also be doing an article on our new school. Mr. Barger asked current students if their sibling will be coming to VAIHS and 29 said they believe so. We will be making phone calls starting with those that we know have siblings. Mr. Barger also shared that the siblings may not know that they need to have a packet completed by the dead line of March 1, 2010.

Adjournment: Mrs. Misciagna motioned to adjourn the meeting was seconded by Mr. Burns meeting was adjourned 6:10 pm.

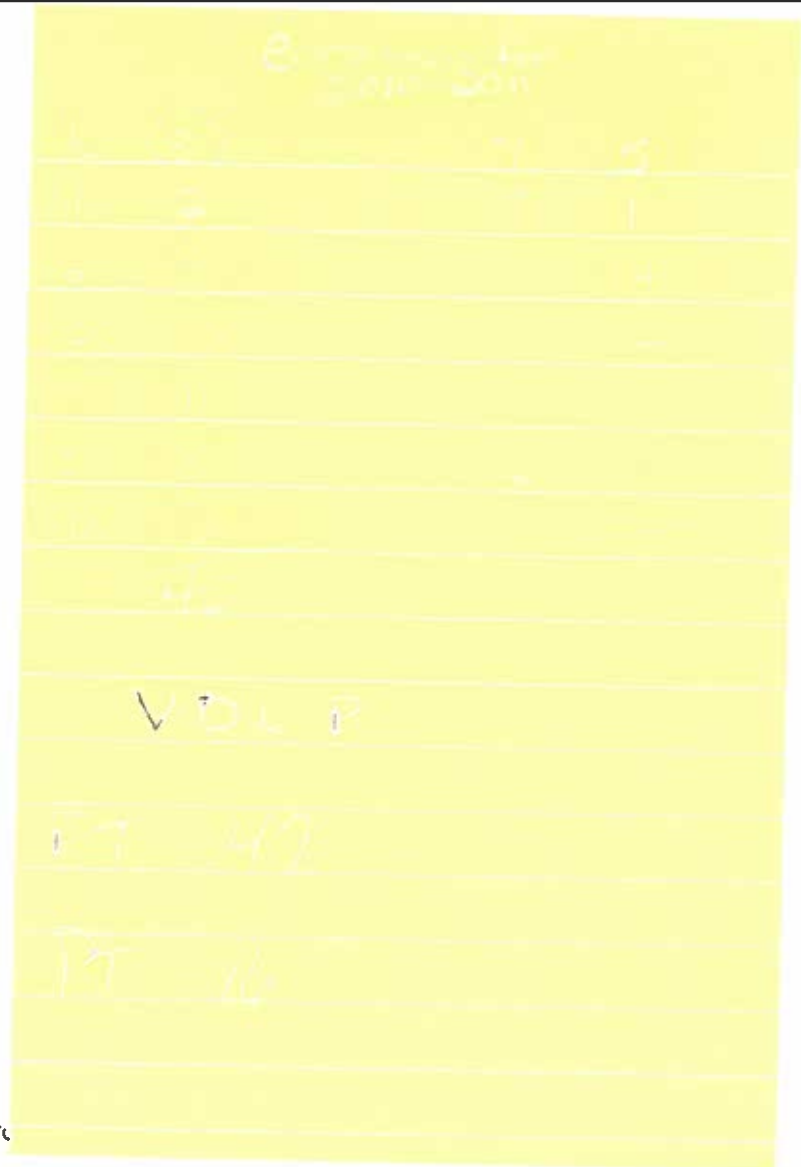
