Before the meeting was called to order Mr. Barger introduced the new member Mr. Bryan Witzens. Mr. Witzens will be taking the place of Kirstie Albright.

Ms. Creasy called the meeting to order at 4:47 pm.

Minutes Motion made by Mrs. Whitlow, seconded by Mrs. Young. Minutes were approved with grammar corrections.

Administrative Reports: Mr. Barger reported we have 2 big events coming up on campus: start of state testing, AIMS, Stanford 10, ACT and 8th grade explore, and the Boxer Expo on April 25th (Mr. Gutman and Mr. Friggle are in charge).

Recognitions:

Mr. Barger recognized Mr. Don Adams and the Robotics . This year we made it to the semi finals in both regionals that we attended. Overall it was a good season. We won awards at both regionals: one for design in California and one at the Arizona regional for spirit. Our team was loud and proud and having fun. Remy won a dance off with California. He represented the state oa Arizona and won.

They are getting ready for state competition and when we meet again they will have finished state and we will be ale to announce if we have several students going onto nationals in Tennessee. Mrs. Ellis had several students in over Spring break working on their projects for state.

Ms. Carruth and her Wright Flight program had a bunch of kids flying planes over Spring Break.

Ms. Carruth and Ms. Jenkins for the Odyssey of the Minds. This was a program that Mrs. Smith started and when she left in January Ms. Carruth and Ms. Jenkins took over.

The PTSA for the Read-A-Thon this spring. Although they did not reach their goal, they were not far off it. We had 7 students hit the \$100.00 mark and had lunch with Mr. Barger.

Old Business:

A. Enrollment Summary

Mr. Barger presented numbers to the council. Mr. Barger shared that the numbers are pretty solid for elementary, a little down for middle school and good for high school, senior class is low but it has been all year. Of the 38 juniors many are protected to return as our seniors. We are looking pretty good. The one area that is a little concern is we have 48 sophomores and we should start with 40 juniors.

B. Staff Update

Mr. Barger shared with the council this year is a year we have a lot of turn over. Last year we hired two professional staff to join us, this year we are hiring 11. Mr. Barger would like to send out some of the information in an email so parents hear it from him. As most of you know Linda Creason our Kindergarten teacher is retiring. Our 4th grade teacher Ms. Carruth will be leaving us in about 3 weeks. Then we have our 5th grade teacher Ms. Jenkins that will be going back to the North West where she has family. Ms. Maass our Social Studies teacher has been recruited by Catalina Foothills where she accepted the position. Mrs. Lehr our English teacher has been offered a job teaching at Sahuarita High School where her husband works. Mrs. Harrington our Science teacher had a baby during our Spring Break and will not be returning. She is going to be a stay at home mom. Mr. Guerrero our Math/Science teacher will be moving on and trying something different. Mrs. Guerrero our high school Math teacher will be going to Marana Middle School closer to home. Mr. Adams our high school science teacher will be retiring. Mrs. Jones our Music teacher will relocate to Del Rio, Texas (her husband was transferred).

Gwen Nipp will be our Kindergarten teacher, Ashley Curtis from Cottonwood will be our 5th grade teacher and Kim Roberts will be joining us after 20 years in Sunnyside and teaching 2nd grade. Over the Spring Break Amy Granatowski left the front office and Stacy Whitlow has moved from Kinder/1st grade parapro to the front office. So we are interviewing for a new parapro.

C. A+ Visit

Mr. Barger shared with the council information on our visit March 6th and 7th right before our break. Two judges both were from the Phoenix area conducted it. They came down and spent all day Thursday and half day Friday with us. They visited classrooms, had meetings with certified staff, parents, students and classified staff. Met with Mr. Barger and Mr. Fester Friday right before they left. We get word back Thursday, April 24th. The people that were here are not the ones that make the decision. They go back to a panel and give their recommendation and that panel will make the decision. If we do not get it we can apply next year. We can keep the title for 3 years and then renew again if we do receive the A+.

D. Student Handbook

All members of the council were given a copy of the student handbook at last meeting to review. Issues that come up can be discussed. There are certain things that are required by law to have in the handbook. We are required to have something on Bulling and Student Concerns and Grieves. An electronic version is on our web site. For the most part there is no need for change. Any questions bring it up at the next meeting, as the goal is to have this reviewed and done by May 1st for printing.

New Business:

A. Enrollment Capacity

We talked about how many kids we will have in each grade but we have never formally set the enrollment capacity for 14-15. Site Councils have the authority to establish that and put it in effect. Recommendation from Mr. Barger is that the site council approves the K-8 numbers as have been in the past and formally approve the plus 3 in grade 9 - 12. Motion was made by Mr. Jon Thomas to approve numbers as presented seconded by Mrs. Stacy Whitlow. All in favor, motion approved.

B. Enrollment Freeze

Mr. Barger would like the council to establish a date where we simply say we are not enrolling students for the rest of the year. Mr. Barger's recommendation is the council freezes enrollment starting April 1, 2014 with possible exceptions for current sibling. A motion was made by Mr. Thomas seconded by Ms. Creasy. All in favor, motion approved.

C. Adjournment

Ms. Creasy motioned to adjourn, Mrs. Young seconded, meeting was adjourned at 5:35 pm.

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NEW BUSINESS

2014-2015 Education Enrichment Plans (EEPs)

Kindergarten Family Night Workshops (Gwen Knipp)

There will be four evenings throughout the 2014-2015 school year. Each session will focus on a different curriculum area. These include: phonemic awareness, reading skills, science, and math skills. All of the games and activities the families will encounter focus on the Arizona College and Career Readiness Standards for Kindergarten.

Science Olympiad (Amanda Stevens)

I will be continuing with Science Olympiad next year. The goal of science olympiad is to create a team of young scientists in grade levels 3-5 who will be given the opportunity to enrich and enhances classroom experiences by creating and testing experiments in a collaborative environment. The students will plan, collaborate, construct, and test an experiment each week. These challenging and motivational experiments are well balanced between the various science disciplines of biology, earth science, chemistry, physics and technology. There is also a balance between experiments requiring knowledge of science concepts, process skills and science applications.

Middle School Future Business Leaders of America (Julie Ellis)

I am submitting to the committee a request to renew the Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) Middle Level program for the 2014-2015 school year. This program will be submitted as an EEP to the Vail School District. As in the past this program will maintain its objectives focus on three goals. Service, Education and Progress.

Classroom Economy (Julie Ellis)

This is the current program run for students in grades K-5 where incentives and rewards are provided for students who save the classroom dollars. During 2013-14 this was run through a classroom, but next year's schedule will not allow for that to occur.

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Boxer Run Club (Bryan Frausel)

I am submitting to this committee a request to renew the Boxer Run Club program for the 2014 -2015 school year. This program will be submitted as an EEP to the Vail School District. As in the past, this program will maintain its objective to teach students to set goals and work to achieve those goals. It is designed for students who may not be involved in extra curricular sports activities and gives them an opportunity to learn to set their own goals in a healthy, encouraging and lifetime activity.

Chess Club (Ed Kestler)

Once again I would like to sponsor chess. Currently I sponsor the chess club, which is open to students K-12. Chess is a great opportunity for students of all ages to develop both mental and social skills.

The chess club is broken up into two groups: Elementary and High School competition Team. The high school chess team travels nearly every weekend from August to November for tournaments. Much of my time commitment is involved in taking them to tournaments and helping them after each game.

Yearbook (Beth Campanile)

Students will produce a yearbook for the end of the 2014-15 school year. There is no significant change from this year's plan.

Math Club (Donna Misciagna)

Students in middle school and high school will compete in events in Tucson and possibly across the state. This includes working with student to prepare them for the Math Bowl at Vail Pride Day in elementary, middle and high school divisions. There are no significant changes from this year's plan.
