Administrative Reports: Mr. Barger reported we are just wrapping up the spring state mandating testing. We still have a couple tests to finish. We do the Explore test for 8th graders, the ACT in 2 days for our juniors. AP Government test will be May 13, 2014. A few years ago the site council to up the graduation requirements for students to need 2 years honors or AP classes before they graduated. Last year we administered 20 AP exams this year we are administrating 40, we are headed in the right direction.

We have the results from high school from February AIMS-Writing we have 88%. Reading 96% pass.

Mrs. Ellis for winning the FBLA Advisor of The Year for the state of Arizona. We had a wonderful conference with over 6 first place, over 3 second place, over 5 third place and 5 fourth place. We also had the highest-level award the America award for 3 of our students. This is for Middle School and High School. Three years ago we sent 3 to nationals, 2 years ago we sent 5, last year we sent 7 and this year we are sending 14 to Nationals. We were recognized as the 3<sup>rd</sup> most successful chapter at the end of the conference. The largest chapter in the state has 257 members. We took 43 students to the state conference. We are much smaller but producing big results. We also have a state officer Brandon LeBlane this year we have another FBLA State Officer Brynne Peters for next year.

Mr. Fester recognized Mrs. Tricia Kaparoff for Cake Club, she had 11 students enter cakes in the Pima County Fair where they all won 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> place.

Ms. Ross recognized three of our students Remy Knauer, Michael Barger and Laurel Wettstein that were on the Morning Blend with Mr. Adams for Robotics. They did a great job.

Mr. Roberts recognized Mrs. Murray, Ms. Pratt, Mrs. Stevens, Ms. Jenkins, Mr. Johnson, Mr. Guerrero, Ms. Runyon, Mrs. Lehr, Mrs. Ellis and Mrs. Ferrell for all their help with the VDLP students during the state testing.

### GOAL # 1 ACADEMIC

Students will be assessed in reading speed and accuracy using the S.T.E.E.P. process.

100% of K-8 studen's will demonstrate an average growth of 10% or more as measured from their first scheduled screenings.

9-12 students will be screened using the same format. 90% of high school teachers will select two reading p issages per quarter (2<sup>nd</sup> -4<sup>th</sup> quarters) with an appropriate lexile level to help students improve reading comprehension. 90% of students in the frustrational or instructional range. In their first screening, will show a minimum of 10% growth by their last screening.

OUTCOME - PART A. % Growth: K= 68%;  $1^{st}$ = 79%;  $2^{nd}$ = 25%;  $3^{rd}$ = 38%,  $4^{th}$ = 36%,  $5^{th}$ = 12%,  $6^{th}$ = 21%,  $7^{th}$ = 20%,  $8^{th}$ = 28%.

PART B.1 90% of teachers have met their portion of the goal.

PART B.2 90% of students in frustrational/instructional range did NOT yet meet. We need 7 of remaining 13 students to be to sted again, which will be done on Wednesday, May 14, 2014.

### GOAL # 2 COMMUNICA I: DN

Certified staff will send point inds home to parents. These postcards are intended to be specific to each student and of a point is nature. The goal is that a staff member will send home an average of one card per month for each class they teach (ex. a teacher who is only 3/5ths would send home three per month). A record will be kept so that one student does not receive 15 postcards and another student zero. This will be for the months of September through May (with December and March counting as one month combined).

OUTCOME. Full time starf were expected to do a minimum of 40 cards, and for each 1/5 off of a full contract teachers were (x) ected to complete 8 less, 32, 24, 16, etc. A total of 1095 cards were expected, to date we sent 146 cards have been sent. We have met this goal!
