**Administrative Reports**

Mr. Barger reported on the completion of the AIMS test and ACT first time during the school day held at Vail High School. The Senior Exit Project done and behind us. Senior trip coming up May 19<sup>th</sup> to the 23<sup>rd</sup>. Mr. Barger and Mrs. Kaparoff will be driving 18 seniors to California to Disneyland, California Adventures, Medieval Times, Six Flags Magic Mountain and the beach. Senior dinner will be held Monday, May 17<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm over at Empire cafeteria. Graduation will be Tuesday, May 25<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm at The Vail Theater of the Arts. Mr. Barger shared with the council how Vail High School specializes graduation for our seniors and invited the council to join us for this special event.

**E. Call to the Public**

No public request to speak were made.

**F. Recognitions**

Mr. Barger recognized Mr. Frausel and Student Council for a very successful Prom held at the UofA Marriott. Kids were very well behaved and seemed to enjoy themselves. Mr. Barger also recognized two of our staff from Vail Academy Wendy Smith and Jen Holt for organizing a Spring Fling for parents and students of Vail Academy and High School to meet and enjoy a night of fun. Families were asked to donate desserts, pizza will be brought in along with two jumping castles for the kids to enjoy along with a game of tug of war.

## **2. Old Business**

### **A. Enrollment Summary**

The numbers as of today is 154. Mr. Barger shared with the council that the numbers in February was 154, March 156, April 156 and May we are at 154 we flex between 154 and 156 for the past several months. Our Vail Distance Learning is at 51 Fulltime and 6 part-time.

### **B. Construction Update**

Mr. Barger informed the council the building is up the roof is textured on the elementary side. Paint sometime next week. Mr. Barger feels the elementary side will be complete within the next 2 to 2 1/2 weeks. The outside overhangs are finished. Admin office drywall end of the week. They have a crew that is working one right after the other. A dry wall crew goes in finish go to the next room behind them the painters come in. Mr. Barger shared with the council the school should be done sometime in mid June but due to Water, TEP and ADOT we may not receive the keys until 2<sup>nd</sup> week of July.

### **C. 10/11 Enrollment Update**

Mr. Barger shared with the council we have a spreadsheet to show how many student's we have enrolled in all grades and how many are on the waiting list and what schools they are coming from or if they are out of district. As of today all grade levels K-8 are full and have a waiting list. Looks like we may start the school year with just about 474 students K-12. We are still receiving enrollment packets.

### **D. Staffing Update**

Mr. Barger shared with the council a hiring update. Change in Special Ed. Misty Warren will be leaving Vail High School to pursue a PHD and moving to Phoenix. Assistant to the Principal John Roberts will be focusing on Vail Distance Learning, Teaching and Technology. It was asked if there will be another principal for the K-6 side. Mr. Barger explained that there will be one principal for K-12. Mr. Barger also shared with the council he is looking to hire a part time Music and P.E. teacher.

### **E. VAHS Logo**

Last month Mr. Barger presented logos to the council and asked what they thought. The council and staff thought some where a little busy. Mr. Barger came back with new designs and shared with the council the new logo for Vail Academy and High School. All were in favor of the new logo for Vail Academy and High School. Mr. Barger will order shirts with the new logo to have ready for the Spring Fling.

### **F. Full Day Kindergarten**

Mr. Barger shared with the council information on a meeting held with kindergarten parents regarding charging for full day kinder. Out of the 22 families, 15 families came to the meeting. Parents were on board with charging a fee. Mr. Barger spoke about the cost being \$1,600.00 per year. Mr. Barger shared the reason for charging is that the state has stopped funding full day kindergarten. Mr. Barger also informed the council that parents can use tax credit money to help pay the cost. They could use other family members such as grandparents; aunts to use donate tax credit money to help.

### **G. Full Day Kindergarten**

Mr. Barger asked the council to approve the cost of \$1,600.00 per student in the kindergarten class. Motion was made by Mr. Letcher to set the fee at \$1,600.00 for full day kindergarten; motion was seconded by Mrs. Nickerson all were in favor. Motion was passed the fee of \$1,600.00 will be charged to each family for full day kindergarten.

### **II. Student Handbook**

Mr. Barger shared with the council the hand book from this year and questioned if we need to put in the dress code, code of conduct. Does the elementary and high School have the same agenda or should they be different. Mr. Barger asked that the council look at the hand book and email him with any changes they think should be made.

### **3. New Business**

#### **A. Furniture Update**

Mr. Barger has been meeting with a company to furnish desks and tables for the new school. He also shared that the money for the furniture was added in to the construction cost. There will be desks in K-8 the high school will have tables due to the lab tops. A question was asked if the site council would be able to see the new school. Mr. Barger will take those wishing to see the new school out today after the meeting. Mr. Barger also shared with the council the guard station off the Kolb entrance will be moved up past the school.

Adjournment: Mrs. Nickerson motioned to adjourn the meeting was seconded by Mrs. Massingill meeting was adjourned 5:30 pm.

## Vail High School 301 goals 2009-2010

1. **ACADEMIC #1** 100% of certified staff will visit other teacher's classrooms per semester and conduct a minimum of 30 minute observations. One of these visits should be at a school other than VHS. Teachers will fill out an observation form and submit them to the principal. Staff that are 4 5ths or more will conduct 3 visits per semester; and staff that work up to 3 5ths will conduct 2 visits per semester. Teachers will be responsible for arranging their own substitutes if needed.
  
2. **ACADEMIC #2** 100% of Advisor Base classrooms will implement Navigation 101. Navigation 101 is an internet program designed to prepare students for postsecondary life, whether it be college or career. 90% of students will complete all grade specific activities designed to assist with college and career readiness.
  
3. **COMMUNICATION #1** Certified staff will send postcards home to parents. These postcards are intended to be specific to each student and of a positive nature. The goal is that a staff member will send home an average of one card per month for each class they teach (ex. a teacher who is only 3 5<sup>th</sup> would send home three per month). A record will be kept in the front office so that one student does not receive 15 postcards and another student zero. This will be for the months of September through May with December and March counting as one month combined.

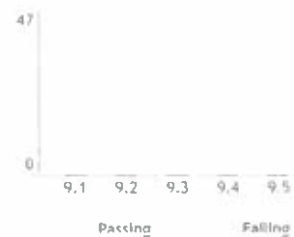
